

Become a Candidate for Reeve, Deputy Reeve or Councillor

The next municipal election will be held on Monday, October 22, 2018.

Until a Nomination Paper is filed, a candidate cannot raise or spend any money on his/her campaign.

Contributions are considered to be any money, goods or services given to and accepted by, or on behalf of the candidate for his/her campaign.

A candidate's election period begins on the date the candidate files a Nomination Paper.

It is the responsibility of each candidate to ensure they are qualified to run in the office to which they seek election.

Nomination Information

Filing of Nomination

- Either in person or through an agent, (faxed or electronic submissions are NOT accepted), Nomination Papers for Reeve, Deputy Reeve and Councillor will be received by the **Municipal Clerk** during the nomination period, as described below, at the Office of the Clerk, Municipality of Tudor and Cashel, 371 Weslemkoon Lake Road, Gilmour, ON K0L 1W0.
- Each candidate must provide proof of Canadian citizenship in a form acceptable to the Clerk. The onus is on the candidate to file a bona fide Nomination Paper.
- Each candidate must complete a Declaration of Qualification as part of the Nomination Form.
- Prescribed forms will be available April 2018.

Filing Fee

A Nomination Filing fee of \$200.00 for office of the Reeve or \$100.00 for Deputy Reeve or Councillor must be paid in cash, certified cheque, or money order payable to The Township of Tudor and Cashel.

Registered Candidates/Third Party Advertisers are required to identify themselves on their election campaign advertisements.

Qualifications for Mayor, Deputy Mayor or Councillor

Every person is qualified to be elected to hold office of Mayor, Deputy Mayor or Councillor, if on the day the nomination paper is filed, the person is:

- A Canadian citizen
- At least 18 years of age
- Must qualify as a resident or non-resident elector
(see <http://www.mah.gov.on.ca/Page10475.aspx>) Eligibility to run
- An owner or tenant of land, or the spouse of the owner or tenant
- Not legally prohibited from voting
- Not disqualified by any legislation from holding municipal office

Who cannot be a candidate

The following are disqualified from being elected or holding office as the Mayor or Councillor:

- A judge of any court
- A member of the Provincial Legislature, the Federal House of Commons or senate who has not resigned from their office by the close of nominations. Proof of resignation must be provided by the close of nominations of the Clerk will not certify the nomination.
- A candidate who failed to file the necessary financial statement in the last municipal election or by-election.
- An inmate serving a sentence in a penal or correctional institute.
