

Bancroft District Fish Stocking Program - Minden Area 2017



Our annual fish stocking program this year resulted in the distribution of more than 85,000 fish (lake trout, brook trout, splake, rainbow trout, and walleye) into local waterbodies across Minden/Haliburton area.

The Haliburton Highlands Outdoors Association (HHOA), through their community fish hatchery successfully raised and stocked 40% of these fish. The Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNR) thanks all of the dedicated volunteers who help contribute to the stocking program. Your continued assistance with the annual wild egg collections and fisheries assessment projects is greatly appreciated.

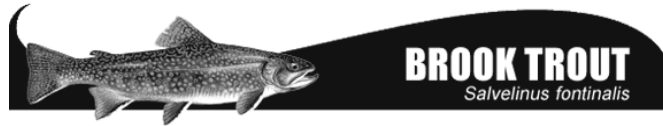
Fish ON-Line is a one-stop shop for information on over 13,000 lakes across Ontario including:

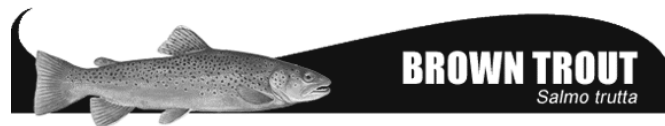

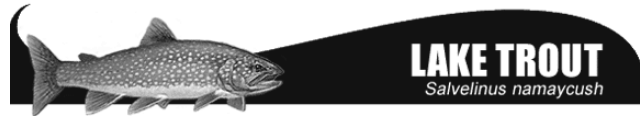

Registration and Removal of Ice Huts

To protect the environment and ensure safety, anglers must register new or previously unregistered ice-fishing huts on area lakes.

Registration is free and helps discourage anglers from abandoning their huts, which can end up in waterways and washed up on shorelines when the ice thaws.

- Huts must be registered in Fishery Management Zones 9-12 and 14-20.
- For ice hut registration online refer to the [Ontario Fishing Regulations Summary](#) available at ontario.ca/fishing.
- An individual only needs to register once and those with an existing ice hut registration number do not need to re-register.
- Once registered, an ice-fishing hut can be used anywhere in Ontario.
- Registration numbers on ice huts must be at least 6.3 centimeters (2.5 inches) in height and clearly displayed on the outside of the hut.
- Tent-style ice huts made of cloth or synthetic fabric that have a base area of seven square meters (75.4 square feet) or less when erected do not need to be registered.
- It's a good idea to place huts on 15-centimetre (six-inch) high wooden blocks to make it easier to remove them at the end of the season. Ice hut owners must keep the area around their huts clear of garbage.
- Ice fishing hut removal dates also apply to huts within Fisheries Management Zones 9, 10, 11, 12, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19 and 20. Relevant ice hut removal dates can be found in the Ontario Fishing Regulations Summary or online at: ontario.ca/icefishing.
- Ice huts must be removed from lakes before ice break-up, even if it is before the specified removal date. It is an offence under the Public Lands Act to leave an ice hut after ice break-up.

Report Resource Abuse

Each year the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry lays between 8,000 and 10,000 charges for natural resource violations. Abuse of our natural resources reduces opportunities for everyone and threatens the future sustainability of these resources.



The toll-free **TIPS-MNR** reporting line at **1-877-847-7667** provides a direct line for the public to report resource violations to the ministry 24 hours a day, seven days a week from anywhere in Ontario. If you see an infraction please report it.



Or you may call **Crime Stoppers** toll-free at **1-800-222 TIPS (8477)**. Crime Stoppers is a non-profit organization, which allows tip providers to remain completely anonymous, they do not subscribe to call display and have no interest in learning the identity of tip providers. The call line runs 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Before heading out, anglers should check the current Ontario Recreational Fishing Regulations Summary for complete information on rules, regulations and fishing sanctuaries in their area. The summary is available at your MNR District Office, Service Ontario Government Information Centres, licence issuers and on the Ministry's Publications website.

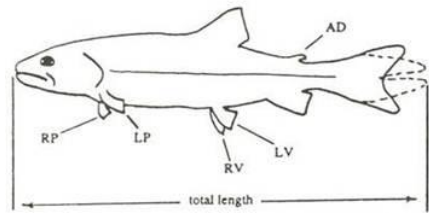
A Note on Our Angler Diary Program
